#### Co-Headteachers' Message

This half term, there have been a multitude of educational visits taking place to enhance and enrich the curriculum. These visits are valuable in developing children's learning experiences outside of the classroom. The visits that have taken place this half term, have provided a unique opportunity for children to explore new places and cultures as well as promoting their social development.

We started the Spring term with Key Stage 1 and Years 4 and 5 visiting Milton Keynes theatre to watch Cinderella. A few weeks ago, a group of children from Year 2 upwards visited Wembley and participated in the Young Voices concert. Our children sang as part of a choir of five thousand children, from all over the country. Children, staff and parents who attended, all agreed that it was a spectacular event and a memorable experience.

In the last week of half term, Year 1 went on a walk around the local area as part of their geography topic 'Our Local Area'. Year 4 visited the Gurdwara to develop their RE knowledge and Year 5 met children from St Martin de Porres Primary School at the Stockwood Discovery Centre. This was part of their School Linking project. All the educational visits have made learning meaningful and exciting and next half term, we have more planned.

Thank you to the parents who responded to our catering survey. In April, Leicestershire will no longer be our catering providers, as we will be taking ownership of providing our own school meals. We aim to provide quality meals that appeal to the children and are good value for money. We will take on board the feedback that you have given us and we are in the process of planning a new menu. At the start of the summer term, we will hold a launch event where you can come and look at the menu and sample some of the meals.

We hope that you and the children are having a relaxing half term break and we look forward to the children returning to school on Monday 26th February.



#### **School Council**

Our School Council consists of a representative from each class from Years 1 to Year 6. They meet weekly and set their own agenda, focusing on their aims on how they wish to develop and improve school life. Please find an update on the work that they have been doing so far. Their focus this term has been on the environment:

'We have written to the Council and companies asking for litter pickers. We have been around the school, finding and taking pictures of all the litter on our school grounds. To go along with that, we have made posters, telling the whole school about litter. We are planning a whole school assembly so we can tell the school about the impact of litter.

As part of the Great British Spring Clean (15th-31st March), we are planning a day where children come to school dressed in green. We will be asking for donations so we can buy additional litter pickers. More information will follow next half term.

We also went bird watching as part of the RSPB project and we have contacted them to let them know how many birds we saw.'



## **Year 5 School Linking Project**

Our Year 5 cohort are involved in a Luton project. Each class is linking with a corresponding Year 5 class. The project aims to develop children's communication and social skills and this half term, the children finally met each other at the Stockwood Discovery Centre. The children worked in groups from both schools. They constructed a carriage from Giant Meccano that could carry a member of the group across the museum. For PE days, children must come in navy joggers/ shorts and red T Shirt and red / blue sweatshirt or school jumper.








# World Book Day 7th March 2024
