Co-Headteachers' Message

Welcome back to the second half of the autumn term, The first half term of the new academic year seems to have flown by! Our new Reception cohort, have settled in well in their new classrooms and all the children across the school have been working hard with their learning.

Last half term, we celebrated Bramingham's 30th birthday with the children participating in a range of activities. These included: beatboxing, Teaching Talons, Junkyard Funk as well as our Colour Run, which was enjoyed by staff and children. We would like to thank you for your generosity as we raised £6594.30. This, and the money from the summer term's Royal Ramble will be used to purchase our inclusive play equipment.

Trips are an important part of our curriculum as they enhance the children's learning. Last half term, we had a number of trips with Year 2 visiting Warwick Castle as part of their learning about castles; Year 3 had their overnight camp at school; Year 4 visited the Mandir as part of their RE work; Year 5 visited Wardown Park museum as part of their learning about Victorian Luton and Year 6 welcomed the Young Shakespeare Theatre Company for their interactive performance of Macbeth. These experiences are valuable as they not only develop wider social skills but they help deepen the children's learning.

Thank you to parents who attended our information sessions. We have shared information on Reading and epraise in Reception, Standards and Expectations in Year 1, the Multiplication Test Check in Year 4 and Standards and Expectations in Year 6. We will be hosting more information sessions throughout the year, all focused on how you can best work with us to support your child with their learning.

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Breakfast and Afterschool Clubs—Important Notice

We have always been very keen to support parents in providing wrap around care. We have kept our prices low in comparison to many other external providers, so that our service is accessible. However, it is imperative that parents book and pay in a timely manner so that we have enough staff to cover.

We have reviewed our system and bookings for Breakfast and Afterschool club.

From Friday 10th November we will no longer take any bookings for the coming week after the Friday before. All bookings for the forthcoming week must be made and paid for online, via our Eduspot system, by the Friday at 3pm (at the latest) of the week before.

If you know that you will use the provision regularly, we advise that you book the half term in advance to secure a place for your child. Numbers for both clubs are limited and due to health and safety, we will not accept any bookings later than the Friday at 3pm. Please do not bring your child to Breakfast Club if you have not booked your child in.

CAMH Drop—14th November

At Bramingham, we are fortunate to work very closely with the School's Team at the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Team (CAMH) in Luton.

We have had feedback from parents who would like some more information and to talk through specific worries or concerns they may have about their children. This may be around anxiety, sleep, eating, worries your children may have and behaviour. It is not a therapeutic session but an opportunity to talk with the clinicians, should they feel a referral for more support is needed this will be discussed with you at the time.
