English

Our work will be based on the book 'Stone Age Boy' by The children will learn how to create suspense in their writing and they will write a 'Tale of Fear'. Later in the term they will write a recount about our trip to the Celtic Harmony Village. The children will be learning how to write their own 'Limericks' in our poetry lessons. In our reading lessons, we will develop the different reading skills by reading a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts.

Music

Children will continue to learn the violin with our specialist music teacher. They will be learning how to read notation and improving their bowing skills.

Art

Children will explore the human form resulting in creating a wire and foil sculpture. They will learn about how different artists including Alberto Giacometii represent the human form.

Science

Children will continue learning about forces and magnets in science. They will explore magnetic poles, understand the use of magnets in a compass and everyday items. Later on in the term, children will start their topic on plants. They will identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers.

Year 3-Spring 2

What are the secrets of the Stone Age, Bronze age and Iron age?

History

Children will learn about the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. They will look at evidence and ask questions. They will develop an understanding of chronology by learning about key dates. We will be visiting the Celtic Harmony Village where the children will experience being Stone Age ' Hunter Gatherers'.

PSHE Children will learn how families differ from each other (including that not every family has the same family structure), how people within families should care for each other and how to ask for help or advice.

Computing

Children will be capturing and editing digital still images to produce a stop-frame animation that tells a story.

RE

In RE, children will learn about Holy Week and understand the importance of and relevance of Good Friday. Children will be exploring why Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'

Maths

Children will be learning about fractions this term. They will compare and order unit and non-unit fractions, as well as count in fractions on a number line.

Children will then learn about mass, capacity and volume which will involve measuring, comparing, adding and subtracting, grams, kilograms, millilitres and litres.

French

The children will learn the key words and phrases for describing their families. They will engage in conversations and develop their pronunciation.

PE:

Indoor: Children will develop and improve their throwing, jumping and running skills in different indoor athletic activities.

Outdoor: Children will play a variety of invasion games including netball and hockey. They will explore tactics and learn how to work as a team. Theory: What are the major bones in the body called?
