

English

Our work will be based on the book 'Cendrillon'. Children will learn how to write a wishing tale with a focus on dialogue.

We will also learn how to write a persuasive leaflet.

In our reading comprehension lessons, we will continue to develop a range of different reading skills with a focus this term on summarising and author's choice.

Science

Children will learn about the function of the skeleton. They will learn that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection, and movement. They will identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food.

Maths

Children will learn about time (hours, minutes and seconds) and solve time problems. They will learn geometry and be introduced to the concept of angles, parallel and perpendicular lines, 2D and 3D shapes. Children will learn to interpret pictograms, bar charts and represent data.

Year 3 - Summer 1**What is life like in the Caribbean?****History/Geography**

In history we will be learning about how people from the Caribbean influenced others. In geography, we will be making comparisons between the UK and the Caribbean. We will learn about the human and physical geography of the Caribbean.

French

Children will learn key vocabulary and phrases around the theme of time. They will have opportunities to practise vocabulary in role play situations. They will also learn about French speaking countries in the Caribbean.

Music

The Luton Music Service will continue to provide music sessions. The children will be continuing to learn the ukulele. They will be learning about rhythm, pitch and dynamics. They will perform pieces from different musical genres.

Children will learn about the importance of eating a healthy balanced diet and looking after our teeth.

The children will learn about foods of the Caribbean. They will research, plan, make and evaluate Caribbean patties.

Computing
