English

The children will be writing for a range of purposes and audiences and focusing on a range of genres to demonstrate their writing skills.

In our comprehension sessions, a variety of texts (fiction and nonfiction) will be provided with a focus on the different reading skills and question types.

Music

This unit of work consolidates the learning that has occurred during the year. All the learning is focused on our upcoming musical production, The Lion King.

Art/DT

In art we will be completing our 'Identity artwork'.

In DT, we will then be learning about how pulleys work. We will be designing and making a controllable vehicle which uses a pulley within an electrical circuit. We will then evaluate it.

Science – Evolution and Inheritance

The children will continue to develop their understanding of how living things have changed over time and will recognise that fossils provide information about living things. They will learn about the scientist Charles Darwin and some of his ideas on evolution. They will also continue to develop their scientific enquiry skills.

Year 6 – Summer 1 Does money bring success?

PSHE

We will be looking at how friendships and other relationships change as we get older. We will also be thinking about what else might change as the children become more independent.

History

In this unit, the children will learn about the Tudor times. They will learn about the monarchs, as well as improving the skills of interpretation and how reliable sources are.

Computing

Creating media – 3D Modelling The children will develop their knowledge and understanding of using a computer to produce 3D models.

Maths

We will be covering a wide range of mathematical concepts including: Area and perimeter Angles Coordinates Time 2D and 3D shapes Reflection and translation Ratio Symmetry Simple formulae

French

The children will learn how to tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to and 5- minute intervals.

RE

How do Christians decide how to live? 'What would Jesus do?

PE

Gymnastics: They will be learning how to perform a variety of floor and vault movements.

Sports leadership: The children will draw upon their primary PE education to teach younger children.
